We feel this decision is in the best interests of all and has been taken in conjunction with the South Side Symphony Orchestra.

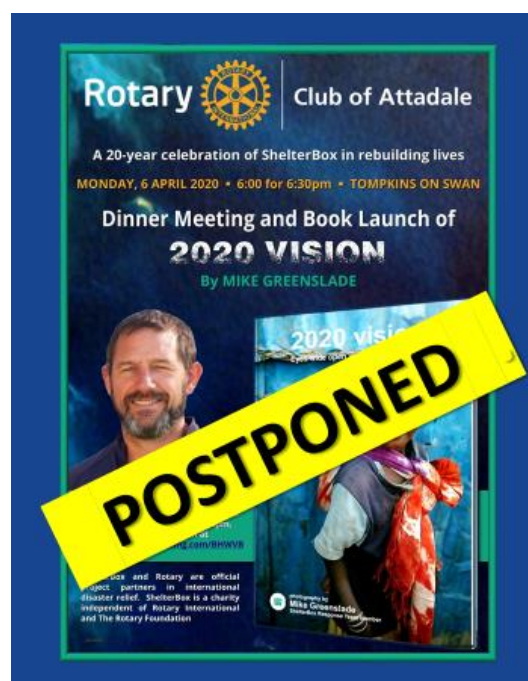
Members of the concert committee are all working to inform everyone of this decision and refund all bookings.

Guest Speaker ~ Llew Withers COVID 19

It was very timely that **Llew** had just attended a briefing on coronavirus at WA Health and that he accepted the offer to give a presentation at our meeting.

To ensure you get all the facts and figures he presented, I have copied his slides into the Bulletin, below.

COVID – 19 – WA Situation

- I was asked to attend a briefing on Friday 13th at WA Health for all EHOs & LGs.
- The meeting was addressed by Dr Paul Armstrong D CDCD WA Health.
- Corona Virus is usually (always) responsible for the common head cold.
- The virus came from the animal world via bats to Salamander to humans.
- It started in Nov 2019 in Wuban China where there was a cluster of cases (infections).
- In 4 months, we have cases in over 100 countries worldwide with 154,480 confirmed cases & 5,700 deaths.
- Australia has 249 confirmed cases (incl. 3 deaths) of which 27 have recovered. All cases in WA due to contact with international travellers.

COVID – 19 – Self protection

- WA Health has tested 2000 persons & no cases recorded within WA (local) transmission.
- 80% of people don't have symptoms, so how do you protect yourself?
- The WA Health believes that we should artificially push down the bubble and spread the contact time longer, which means there are less persons becoming really seriously ill requiring ICU.
- The main transmission pathway is inhaling minute drop lets from persons breathing out water vapour to a radius of 1.5 metres.
- So if you wear a respirator for your own protection, wear a P2 dust mask or a N 95 mask.
- Self isolate for 2 weeks if feeling sick or have travelled home from another country.
- Avoid mass gatherings, may be less responsible people in larger gatherings.
- Corona virus spreads like the flu. However, there is no immunisation available yet.

COVID – 19 – Protecting others

- We need to sanitise commonly handled fittings and fixtures 3 x per day – door handles.
- Provide sanitizers in the bottle.
- You are allowed to keep your hands in your pockets or behind your back.
- Viruses live for several hours, especially if the weather is humid, like now.
- People don't feel sick (about 80%) and don't show any symptoms.
- 80% get a mild cold, of these 20% present to hospital, 5% get to ICU & 1% die.
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Personal Protection

- A P2 dust mask (used for handling asbestos & potting mix) or a N 95 mask is the best protection if you are unwell. If you are well, you don't need a mask.
- Otherwise, the balance of masks are of dubious value.
- Use bleach based cleaning agents or those containing 70% alcohol (hand sanitiser) or have Quarternary Ammonium Compounds on the label.
- Manage your risk at mass gatherings.
- At work, if you are sick stay home – same applies for Rotary.
- Dispose of waste hand towels into the rubbish bin.
- There is no evidence that COVID – 19 is spread in food or by mosquitoes.

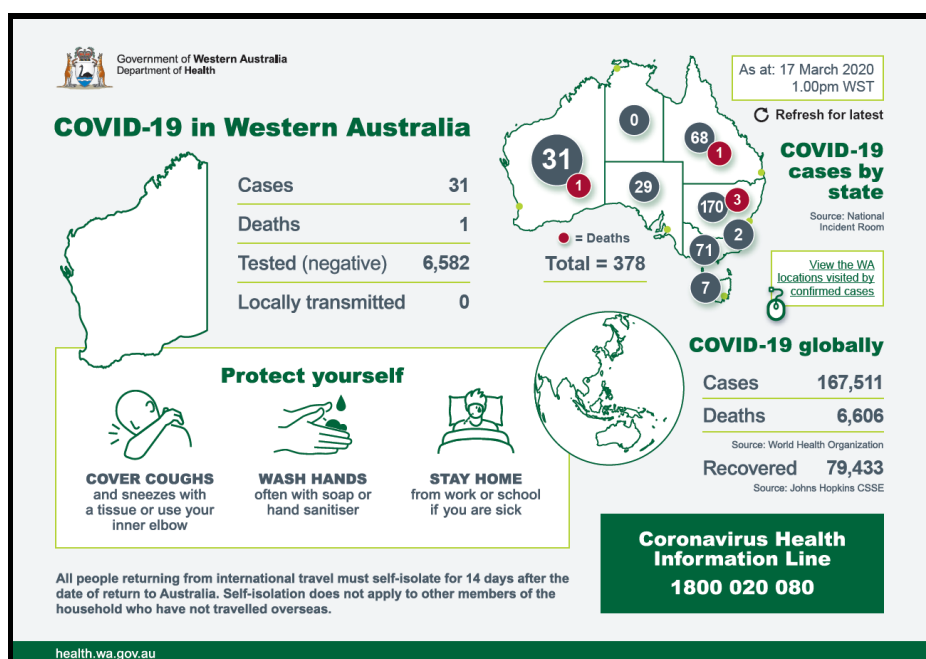

Rotary Charity Golf Day

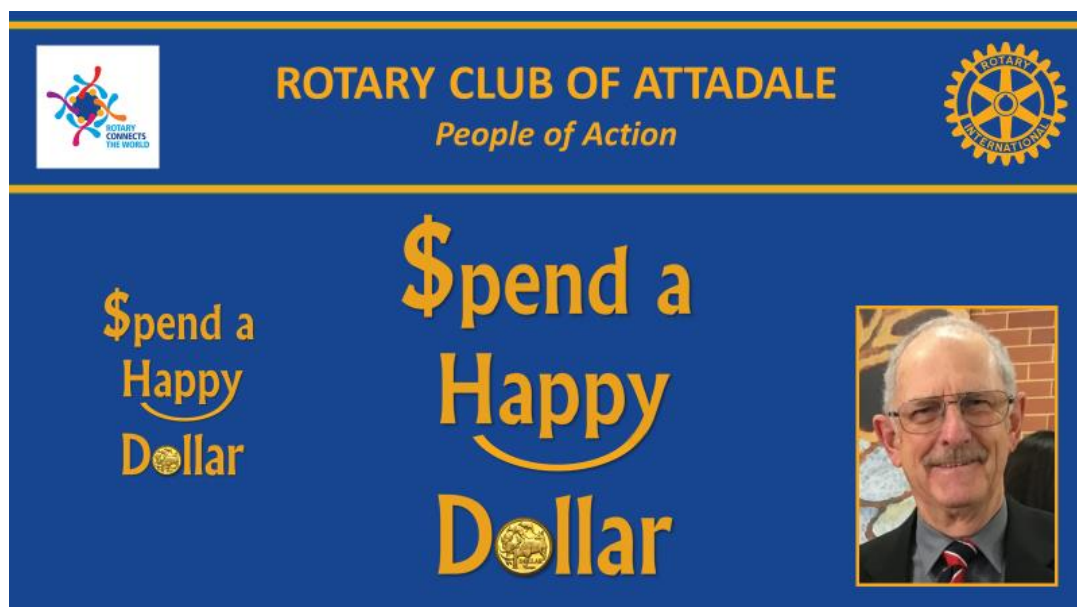

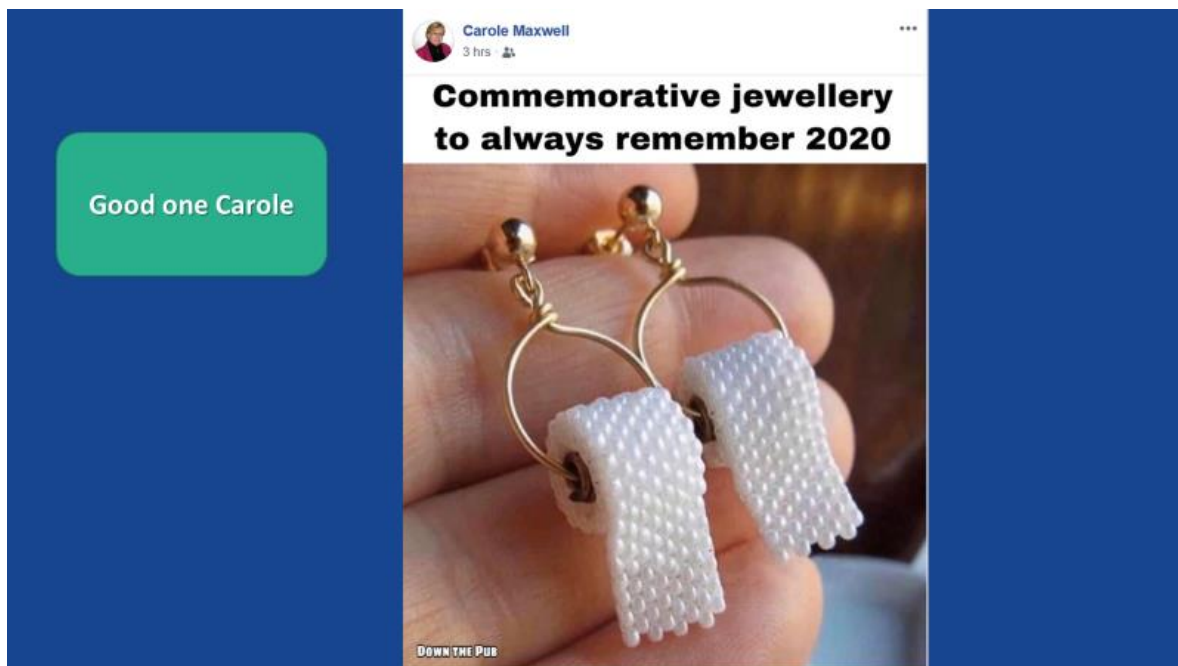

COVID-19

The WA Department of Health recommends that the following behaviours should be promoted:

- practice good respiratory and hand hygiene
- wash hands regularly with soap and water for 20 - 30 seconds, or use an alcohol-based hand rub
- wash your hands before and after eating
- don't touch your face
- cough or sneeze into your elbow and dispose of used tissues immediately
- hand hygiene after coughing, sneezing or blowing nose

Practice social distancing;

- refrain from hand shaking
- keep one and a half metres from others where possible
- **and stay home if you are unwell:** even if you don't think you could have COVID-19

People who have returned from a country or region that is at high or moderate risk for COVID-19 should monitor their health closely.

If you develop symptoms including a fever and cough you should isolate yourself immediately and urgently seek medical attention.

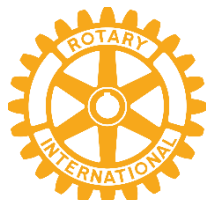
People who think they may have been in close contact with a confirmed case of coronavirus should also monitor their health and seek urgent medical attention.

If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, donations tin, Joker container and two bottles of wine.
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then

- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
 - Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the President
 - Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
 - Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
 - Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
 - Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
