



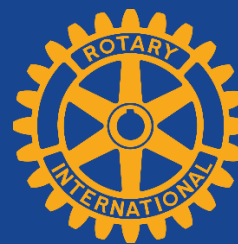

'Foundation Grants Management Seminar Report'

Carole and **Bev** shared the telling of the Foundation Grants Management Seminar, that they both attended for the Rotary Club of Attadale. They explained what the Foundation does and how it works.

The mission of The Rotary Foundation is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

The Foundation is a not-for-profit corporation supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotarians and friends of the Foundation, who share its vision of a better world. This support is essential to make possible Foundation grant funded projects, that bring sustainable improvement to communities in need.

Foundation Grants

The Rotary Foundation offers Rotarians and Clubs two types of grants:

- District Grants
- Global Grants

District Grants

District grants fund short-term projects and activities, either local or international, that support the Foundation's mission.

Clubs submit their funding requests to their district, which administers and distributes the funds. Applications are sought prior to the beginning of the new Rotary Year.

DISTRICT GRANT FUNDING

To Qualify for Grant Funding from the District clubs must meet all of the following criteria

- **Attendance** at Grants Management Seminar
- Completion of a **Memorandum of Understanding**
- Completion of **Club Foundation Goals** in Rotary Club Central
- Club giving to the **Annual Fund** of a **minimum of \$50 AUD per capita** in the prior year
- Have a good record of compliance with reporting criteria on past grants



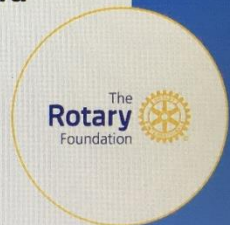
DISTRICT GRANT APPLICATIONS

Grant applications may be for projects both locally and internationally.

- **Grant amounts between A\$1500.00 and A\$3,000.00*****
- Clubs must **part fund** the project
- One Application per club.
- Planned completion of the project in the 2020-21 Rotary Year.

Funds available USD \$29,182

**** dependent on the number of applications received*



Global Grants

Global grants fund large-scale projects and activities that:

- Align with one or more of the Areas of Focus (See below)
- Respond to a need the benefiting community has identified
- Include the active participation of the benefiting community
- Are designed to enable the community to sustain itself after the Rotary club or district has concluded its work
- Have measurable results

Activities funded by global grants include:

- Humanitarian projects addressing community needs by providing sustainable, measurable outcomes in the benefiting community.
- Vocational Training Teams (VTT) build skills within a community by offering local training or by supporting groups of professionals traveling abroad for rigorous study in their profession or to teach local professionals about a particular field. This type of training may be most effective in conjunction with a humanitarian project.
- Scholarships fund study by graduate students, whose career goals support an area of focus.

Projects that receive Global Grant funds from The Rotary Foundation must fall under at least one of the following Six Areas of Focus:

- Peace and conflict prevention/resolution
- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water and sanitation
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Economic and community development

GLOBAL GRANT QUALIFICATION PROCESS

- In order to be qualified, **a club must sign the club Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)** and send at least one member to a grant management seminar organized by the district. Clubs must complete these steps each year to maintain qualified status.
- The club MOU for each Rotary year is signed by the club's president and president-elect for that Rotary year.



THINGS TO CONSIDER WHEN APPLYING FOR GLOBAL GRANTS

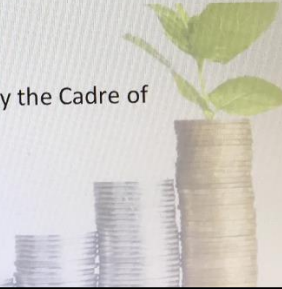
- How does the activity fit within the policies of the areas of focus?
- How can we make the activity sustainable?
- Is there strong community support for the project?
- How will we measure the project's success?
- Who will benefit from the project?
- Is there an element of training?



GLOBAL GRANT FUNDING



- ▶ District Designated Funds (DDF) are matched 100% from The Rotary Foundation
- ▶ Cash (including club contributions) are matched 50% from The Rotary Foundation
- ▶ Non Member cash contributions (not including cooperating organizations or beneficiaries of the project) are matched 50% from The Rotary Foundation
- ▶ Minimum TRF funding = US\$15,000
- ▶ Maximum TRF funding = US\$400,000
- ▶ TRF funding exceeding US\$200,000.00 is subject to review by the Cadre of Technical Advisers.
- ▶ Cash (Club) contributions + 5%
- ▶ Be creative in finding long-term financing beyond Rotary

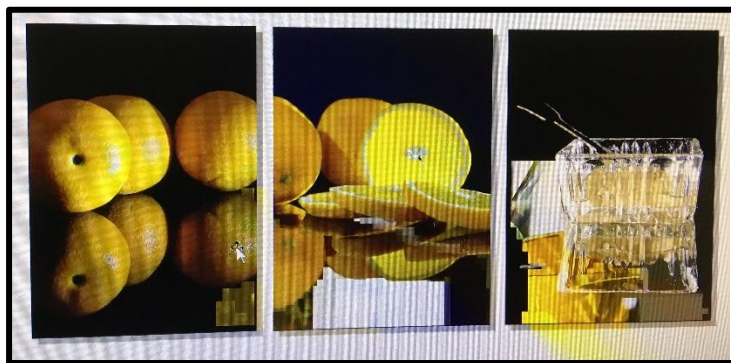
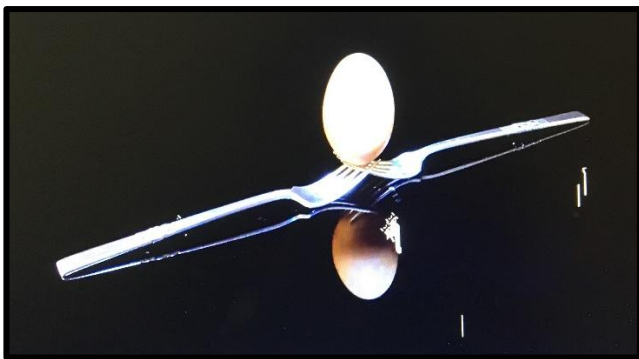
We Care You Share

COVID-19

The WA Department of Health recommends that the following behaviours should be promoted:

- practice good respiratory and hand hygiene
- wash hands regularly with soap and water for 20 - 30 seconds, or use an alcohol-based hand rub
- wash your hands before and after eating
- don't touch your face
- cough or sneeze into your elbow or a tissue and dispose of used tissues immediately
- hand hygiene after coughing, sneezing or blowing nose

Practise social distancing;

- refrain from hand shaking
- keep one and a half metres from others where possible
- **and stay home if you are unwell:** even if you don't think you could have COVID-19

People who have returned from a country or region that is at high or moderate risk for COVID-19 should monitor their health closely.

If you develop symptoms including a fever and cough you should isolate yourself immediately and urgently seek medical attention.

People who think they may have been in close contact with a confirmed case of coronavirus should also monitor their health and seek urgent medical attention.

We are following the current WA Department of Health recommendations which we feel are the most reliable for our circumstances.

Please follow these recommendations closely for the good of all members, particularly those who are in the higher risk category.

The Prime Minister has announced,

'ALL arrivals to Australia from overseas will to be forced to self-isolate for 14 days, this is effective from midnight Sunday 15 March 2020.'
