Lighting Issue at Tompkins on Swan

The ongoing problem of lighting along the pathways and in the carpark might finally be coming to an end.

After numerous phone calls and emails to the Melville City Council CEO, Melville Councillor June Barton and Alex Dowling, Manager at Tompkins on Swan, we have finally been put in touch with Mario Murphy, Manager of City Buildings.

President Gail McCulloch has spoken to him and received an email apologising for the inconvenience and explaining that they have discovered the existing analogue lighting timer is causing the lights to switch on and off at the wrong times.

They have ordered a new digital timer which should be installed this week. In the meantime, they have arranged with Alex (Tompkins on Swan Manager) to manually switch on the pathway lighting every evening. The switch is located in the main board so for safety reasons they cannot allow general access to this switch.

They intend to install a new pathway light along the section of pathway leading to the carpark and when they have a confirmed date for this, they will let us know



Guest Speaker District Governor Wayne Milnes

Wayne was delighted that the Rotary Club of Attadale celebrated '30 Years of Women in Rotary,' as it has been a huge turning point in the history of Rotary, with women taking on all kinds of leadership roles and making a positive difference.

Wayne shared with us Rotary International President Mark Maloney's 2019-20 presidential theme, 'Rotary Connects the World'.

Mark's vision is to build a stronger Rotary, by calling on leaders to expand connections to their communities and to embrace innovative membership models. grow our service, grow the impact of our projects, but most importantly, to grow our membership so that we can achieve more

opportunities to make it easier for busy professionals and people with family obligations to serve in leadership roles, and to welcome children at Rotary events on every level.

During 2019-20, Rotary will host a series of presidential conferences around the world, focusing on Rotary's relationship with the United Nations.

Rotary was one of 42 organizations the United States invited to serve as consultants to its delegation at the 1945 San Francisco conference, which led to the UN's charter.

For decades, Rotary has worked alongside the United Nations to address humanitarian issues around the world. Today, Rotary holds the highest consultative status that the UN offers to non-governmental organizations.

"Rotary shares the United Nations' enduring commitment to a healthier, more peaceful, and more sustainable world," Maloney said. "And Rotary offers something no other organization can match:- an existing infrastructure that allows people from all over the world to connect in a spirit of service and peace and take meaningful action toward that goal."

Rotary brings together a global network of volunteers dedicated to tackling the world's most pressing humanitarian challenges. Rotary connects 1.2 million members in more than 35,000 Rotary clubs in over 200 countries and geographical areas. Their work improves lives at both the local and international levels.

Rotary contributes billions of dollars and millions of volunteer service man-hours to helping make a positive difference around the world. We need to get this information out to those who do not know what Rotary does.

Wayne would like Rotary to form more partnerships with companies or individuals like we have with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to 'End Polio. Every dollar raised by Rotary, is matched with two additional dollars from the Gates Foundation.

Max Bird will be sending out forms for Club Directors to fill in details about their projects. This information will be entered on the District Website for all to see and share.

At the Convention in San Diego all 535 District Governors exchanged business cards.

They agreed to hand one to each president in their district. The President is then to contact that District Governor and share what plans and projects their Club is involved in.

Wayne promoted next year's District Conference which will be held on 20 – 22 March 2020 in Rockingham. Tickets will go on sale on 1 October and there will be raffle tickets available for early bookings.

Leeds and Liverpool Canal Burnley
As Neil remembers it

Neil McKay was born in Burnley which is in the north west of England. It was a working-class town with coal mines and cotton mills. Neil remembers it as not being a very nice place. Even the canal was unattractive!!

When Neil was fourteen his father died so he had to leave school to help support the family. At the age of sixteen he started four years of night school attending three nights a week to get his A Levels.

At age twenty-one Neil came out to Australia as a ten-pound Pom. He spent a few months in Sydney before travelling by train to Perth.

He did a number of FIFO jobs before doing a double degree in Secretarial and Administration at WAIT. Neil then became a Chartered Accountant and worked in a number of interesting jobs as Company Secretary/Accountant. He worked for Kevin Parry during his America's Cup Challenge, started his own business and worked in the Philippines for thirteen years,

Back in Perth he continued to work for exploration companies. He retired but went back to work, forming another public company. Exploration has been his life and he felt it was always better than the Burnley he remembers.







If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig and sign and two bottles of wine.
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
