

Vice Presidents Report for 09/10/23

Unfortunately, President Bev was unable to attend our meeting as she is still suffering from flu and is potentially contagious.

The turnout at the Club Business meeting was average considering how many members are making up for three years of no travel due to COVID. we also had a couple of late apologies, so we had 12 members present.

Board Members present were invited to speak but all declined except Selwyn & I.

I shared the outcome of the meeting Llew, Martin and I had with Peter Kenyon, which we believe offered some opportunities - a couple of which don't need to involve Peter.

- 1. Explore re-engaging honorary members who moved from active membership because of meeting days etc.
- 2. Identify names and contact details of alumni over past 15-20 years from RYLA, Youth Exchange, NYSF, Rotaract
 - a) Invite all respondents to a fun gathering facilitated by Rhys Williams (Mayor of Mandurah) who is the best facilitator of younger people that PK knows
 - b) To that end I invite all members to access their memories, archives and any other source they have and advise me of the names, most recent contact details, which year and which program they attended.

Beyond these two items Peter also outlined his offer, which would be to facilitate at a full club gathering what he calls an Asset Mapping exercise. This process seeks to engage all members in understanding both the club's strengths and individual members strength, passions, capabilities and connections with a view to identifying a project that we can all support and which can be used as a catalyst to attract other like-minded people.

He also stated that he is not driven by money therefore any application for support will be considered, provided he is confident we are serious about the outcome. He suggested Lotteries Commission may be open to a grant request.

I invited volunteers to join me for the Melville Volunteer Manager's Network Meeting on Tuesday, 17 October 2023,, at 9:30–11:00 at Willagee Community Centre, Cnr Archibald and Winnacott Streets, Willagee. Llew nominated to join me which was much appreciated

I called for volunteers for both the Makers Market 5/11/23 & Jacaranda Festival 19/11/23 and a couple of members nominated – we still need more, particularly for Jacaranda Festival. When nominating, please

don't just tick or put yes but, nominate whether you want to do the Welcome, EFTPOS (which is the only job sitting) or Spinner (two required for each slot).

I called for a deputy for me to run the Aspiring Leaders Program as the previous volunteer had withdrawn due to taking on too many commitments. As there were no volunteers, I declared the program would not run in 2024.

Selwyn shared his suggestion that he had put to the Board regarding merging with Fremantle. (At the board meeting he shared the idea but then had to leave the meeting before we could discuss it). The Board decided that more info was required, as we had no idea if this was just Selwyn's idea or whether there was support in Fremantle. Selwyn advised the Club meeting that there were 2 or 3 members of Fremantle who had raised the idea with him, A discussion followed on the merits of merging vs co-locating (Fremantle are apparently down to about 15 members and the venue they meet at have apparently advised that they cannot continue to meet there unless numbers increase).

Co-locating would have the benefit of each club alternately running meetings including most other meeting duties, a larger number in attendance at each meeting making it more attractive to prospective members & guest speakers and it would allow both clubs to get a feel for each other's culture before committing to merge.

Finally, I reiterated that unless we get a nominee for President by the AGM or at the very latest before the changeover, the club would need to hand back it's charter. I also shared my view that it would be easier to attract a nominee for President 24-25 if we already had a robust succession plan in place with a committed President Elect 24-25 as well as a committed President Nominee for 24-25.

Neil ran a different Happy Dollars by donating a dollar for everyone present so that he could make us happy. Mal Bennett won the door prize & I won the Joker raffle but no Joker. •

palliative care nurse at the Cancer Foundation Cottage Hospice in Shenton Park. Years of simultaneous part-time university study culminated in a PhD in creative writing at UWA. Her successful doctoral thesis is at the origin of her novel, Acacia House which has been shortlisted for the TAG Hungerford Award and WA Premier's Book Award. She currently works part-time for Palliative Care WA.

Vivien will sensitively address a topic which many people find hard to face – end of life care. She will discuss the nature of palliative care, mention a few common myths and misconceptions, and touch on Advance Care Planning. She will explain her rationale for writing the novel, Acacia House, give an overview of her research in South Africa, Ireland and Australia, and talk about the novel's three most engaging characters. Vivien will then briefly discuss issues with publication and marketing - despite the accolades the novel has received.

Please nominate your availability for the following times, collecting donations at the Stack Lane Entrance

Please nominate yourself for one of three roles: +Setup

- a. A person to welcome the public and guide them towards the donation points (Welcome)
 - i. reference the two options to make a donation:
 - "if you want EFT, go over there";
 - " "if you want to make a cash donation, go to the spinner".
 - ii. Answer any questions as efficiently as possible to keep the queue moving
 - iii. Refer to the Applecross Story Board that will be in place at each entry point.
 - iv. Refer to the QR code that allows patrons to see the site map, stall locations and other useful information.
 - v. Ask the queue to make way for disabled and/or aged patrons.
 - vi. Discourage dogs. They get frightened and hot in the event space
- b. One person at a bar stool to solicit EFT donations at the eye level of the patrons. (EFTPOS)
- c. One or two persons at a spinner to solicit cash donations. (Spinner)
 - vii. Keep a distinct separation between the spinner and the table with the EFT points.
 - viii. All donations are a voluntary act; patrons do not have to offer a donation.
 - ix. We prefer to ask for a donation,
 - do not ask for a "gold coin", and the best option is an EFT donation.

How to Engage

- Be friendly and positive.
- Engage with the patrons.
 - Offer a warm and enthusiastic welcome.
 - Smile.
 - Offer patrons a site map.
 - Look patrons in the eye. Ask for a donation.
- Use the terms "welcome", "enjoy the event".
- Ask very directly: Please make a donation.
 - Repeat the message in case they did not hear the first time
- Move forward to close the interpersonal space
- Within reason, plead for a donation.

What to expect:

- You must sign in/out at the Rotary table near the car park entrance.
- Wear a hat and sunscreen. Bring a water bottle. Water is available on-site at the water tanks.
- If you get too hot, please move away to a safer area, or go to Kim Giddens office space.
