

The 13th annual Charity Golf day (CGD) was held on Friday the 8th March and from all reports, was an outstanding success. 32 teams of four players took part and in addition of the Major Sponsor there were 4 co-sponsors, Ray White Real Estate, Cash Converters, Rallou Pty Ltd and C Wise. A \$10,000 hole in one prize was sponsored by Loan Market Golden Finance. The Organising Committee was a combination of Attadale and Fremantle Rotary Club members and representatives of the beneficiaries of the event, Care Cure Support (MND charity) and the Spinnaker Health Research Foundation (SHRF).

Some members of Rotary clubs contribute more than others to the activities and projects of their club but it would be hard, if not impossible, to find any who do more than Gail and Colin McCulloch do for the Rotary Club of Attadale (RCA). In the CGD, Gail was responsible for the Auction, Raffle and Prize portfolio which required the identification, collection, placement in the event program and disbursement of well over 100 items from as many donors. The quality of her organization associated with this was unbelievably professional and extremely significant. At the same time Colin was responsible for the identification, collection and distribution of drinks for the players and volunteers, all day. As if that wasn't enough, his experience with audio-visual production skills was put to the test with the A-V materials that were displayed in the clubhouse all day and which supported the presentation of a Live Auction and the prize winners program at the end of the event. A member of the Melville Rotary Club who witnessed the day and was a hole sponsor, James Morris, whose business JTMi Services includes professional IT consultants and support specialists, spoke highly after the presentation of the quality and enormity of Colin's productions. The RCA is greatly appreciative of Gail and Colin's contribution to the event and in fact to just about all other club projects.

But we also had the assistance of well over 10 members and Honorary members during the day. Some of these people are over 90 years of age and they spent most of the afternoon in what turned out to be cold and blowie conditions in the middle of RFGC. Thanks to Keith, Don and Bob and Gillian. To all the others, including the volunteers from Fremantle Rotary Club (FRC), we are extremely grateful for your support and diligence to the tasks you were invited to perform.

This event has now generated nearly \$510,000 for our beneficiaries. We should be proud of that achievement and who knows, it might be on again next year.

The event is a wonderful example of the collaboration that can be achieved amongst Rotary clubs with mutual benefit to all concerned. We thank our members Rod Rate (Organising Chairman) and Martin Houchin together with Kim Passmore and Max Coxall from the RCF for their commitment to the day and the Organising Committee. 
