


Environmental Stories Blossoming in Rotary Media







We have been very fortunate to have heard Radheya speak to us before, after he received an Oscar nomination for his short film work.

Recently he won the main prize, at The Best Australian Short Film competition, and won the Best Animation Award at the BFI Future Film Festival in London, organised by the British Film Institute.

His animated film is 'Bird Drone'.

Radheya spent nearly three years directing and animating the film, and said, creating Bird Drone was a true labour of love.

Throughout the process, he would often wonder if it was worth spending days, to address a tiny detail - so having the film appreciated on this scale certainly felt validating for the effort that he knows has been put into the film, by himself and his wonderful crew. Radheya developed the concept with fellow Curtin graduate and writer Clare Toonen and producer Hannah Ngo.

We enjoyed watching the delightful and heartwarming animated short film, which follows a lonely seagull looking for love, who struggles to accept that his newfound object of affection is a human-operated drone with limited battery life. It's about the bittersweetness of moving on - as one should not dwell on unrequited love - and showing that something which ultimately does not work out can lead to bigger and better things.

Radheya was an inspirational and interesting guest speaker. We wish him well in his future endeavours.

From Melson Mandela to

LOOKING AFTER EAR DISEASE IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Peter Friedland is the Garnett Passe Rodney Williams Foundation Professor of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery (ENT) at UWA and Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital (SCGH), previous Head of Discipline of ENT at Notre Dame University and previous Head of ENT department at SCGH. He was the previous Chair of the WA ENT Training Scheme for the Royal Australian College of Surgeons. He is a committed educator of the next generations of medical students and ENT trainees. In this role, he has received 15 teaching awards, both locally and nationally. Additionally, Peter serves as a Squadron Leader and medical specialist in the No-1 Expeditionary Health Reserves of the RAAF. This squadron performs humanitarian and disaster relief operations in Australia and overseas.

Peter's talk briefly describes his privileged time as Nelson Mandela's ENT for almost nine years and some important lessons he learned. He will then talk about his role as an ENT surgeon working at Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital, outreach Ear trips to the Kimberley and Pilbara and an ENT clinic that Peter runs *pro bono* at Derbarl Yerrigan Aboriginal Health Service in Mirrabooka, Perth. He will discuss the challenges that we face here in Western Australia and what can practically be done to make a positive impact.
