President's report for meeting held on 14 November 2022

We were delighted to welcome Heather McNaught (Honorary member) to our meeting of 17 attendees on Monday night. Once again this was a busy meeting with plenty on the agenda to get through, including our AGM. Colin shared a PowerPoint of recent events to view during the meal. Colin suspended our ordinary meeting whilst the AGM was held. The Minutes of the previous AGM and Financial Report of 2021/2022 were accepted as true records, and the incoming board for 2023/2024 was elected. Most director roles had received nominations prior to the meeting, except for President. Colin asked for any volunteers; however, none were forthcoming.

Congratulations to all members of the incoming board, I look forward to continuing the good works of Attadale Rotary with you all during the 2023/2024 Rotary year.

The regular meeting resumed, with Directors' reports from the Board meeting held on 9th November. Vice President John Sharp spoke about the roster for the Jacaranda Festival on the 19th November, Shelley to attend a briefing prior to the event. Parking at the Maker Market raised a contribution of \$205.00, based on only 2 volunteers turning up on the day. On 18 December Shelley, Colin, Gail and John will do the Makers' Market parking. The City of Melville will once again hold a Summer Music Festival, on 3rd December and 17th December at Centennial Park, Bull Creek. John and others will work with CoM to improve marketing and promotion the event to encourage a larger public attendance. Volunteers for 03 December are Bev, Llew, Joyce and Helen. Volunteers for 17 December are being sought - please contact John. WAISSS parking on 10th November raised \$68.10, this will be handled differently for 27th November, with an upfront donation of \$100 being requested from CoM. Two people will manage the parking from 1645 to 1800.

John has previously discussed requiring a co-ordinator to manage the Aspiring Leader's Programme members whilst he is away from 27 April to 03 July next year. This will have been set up, with applicants approved prior to his departure. The Co-Ordinator will therefore be in an overseeing capacity. Without a co-ordinator across this period, the programme will have to be deferred, so please consider your position, and contact John if you are able to assist. On the 7 th December the local cluster membership committee will meet with Peter Kenyon of Bank of Ideas with a view to progress connecting with potential volunteers in the City of Melville.

Secretary Colin McCulloch shared the parking experience at WAISSS on 10 th November. 4 people were there to assist and definitely not that many required. Refer to John's cover of this for the next session on 27 November.

Colin reminded us that bookings for the Christmas Dinner on Wednesday 14 th December 2022 should be made as soon as possible, to assist with catering and set up requirements. If you have not yet booked your spot, please do this as a matter of some urgency at: <https://www.trybooking.com/CDXYP>

We are investigating running Sausage Sizzles at Bunnings, but before we make this commitment, volunteers to assist are requested. About 16 volunteers are required for each event, so to see if this is worth pursuing please let Colin know if you are available (we understand that the actual date may have an impact on your availability). Colin shared the news that one of our previous Guest Speakers, Short Back and Sidewalks, has just received a Federal Grant of \$400,000.00, well done to a wonderful charity!!!

Colin covered our meeting costs; advising that these do not just cover the meal, but include the cost of the venue, staff required to prepare and serve the meals and beverages, audio and visual equipment, guest speaker meals and gift and raffle prizes. It was my privilege to thank Joyce for organising a great Wine Tour in the Swan Valley on the 9 th November and to Jim and Jenny Calcei, in their absence, for a fabulous Sun-downer at their home on the 11 th November.

It was wonderful to let everyone know that ShelterBox has offered to have our donation of \$2000 doubled in the Giving Day appeal, and of course, the Board was delighted to endorse this. A reminder that the ShelterBox Giving Day will be held on 9 th December, a great time to donate as all donations are doubled by generous sponsors, further details to be advised. 
