President's report for 7 November 2022

With 20 people in attendance, we started off our jam packed agenda by welcoming our DG Ric McDonald and his delightful wife Ailsa, as well as our guest speaker Michael (Bres) Bresnahan and my hubby, Charles. John Sharp gave us a reminder that we are committed to assisting on the roster at the Jacaranda Festival on 19 th November, we had completed the City of Melville Summer concert parking on 5 th November and Makers' Market on 6 th November. We also have the opportunity to assist at two other events, John is looking for volunteers, please see the information later in the Bulletin. If you are on the roster and cannot make it, PLEASE make sure you either arrange a replacement, or advise John so that he can called for a volunteer

Bres presented an intriguing talk on Impact100 Fremantle. Bres has been involved in several not-for-profit organisations, he has also written and performed "It's About Time" at the Perth Fringe Festival. He is the Committee Chair of Impact100, a collective giving charity which comes under the umbrella of the Fremantle Foundation. In general, 100 local people each donate \$1000.00 each year to the fund, the intention is to provide grants of \$100,000 increments annually to support charitable causes, that will have an IMPACT in the local community. Applications for grants are invited from the local non-profit community across 5 focus areas: Arts and Culture, Education, Environment, Health and Wellness and Family and Community. Applicants undergo a vigorous vetting and due diligence process; the shortlisted applicants attend a Grants Award Evening where they are required to make a presentation. The donors are invited to vote on the applications and the winner receives the grant. A truly interesting way of being able to assist in empowering improvements in the local community!

Our DG Ric MacDonald took us through a short personal story before a brief history of Rotary International, the impact of funds raised by Rotary International globally and the major changes to Rotary over the years. Our first female Rotary International President, Jennifer Jones' motto of Imagine Rotary has inspired Ric to work towards increasing the membership in WA to 50,000 in 50 years' time, and for Rotary to be embraced by the next generation. He impressed upon us to Imagine this and reiterated that we need to be part of the change that is required to do this. We are encouraged to create new clubs that do not follow the traditional format, but work with the ways the younger generations will get involved, but by forming Satellite Clubs, Corporate Clubs, Passport Clubs, and Cause Based Clubs. These would come under the umbrella of the host club and the traditional hierarchy of that Club's board. Membership will be the same as that of the host club, ie full members of RI. Ric is challenging all members and clubs to see if this is something we can buy into. Ric also confirmed that the redistricting in Zone 8 has been approved by the majority of clubs. Our last District Conference as D9456 before combining with District 9455 to form one district in WA in July 2023, will take place in Mandurah over the weekend of 17 th and 18 th February 2023. Bev reported on the parking on 5 th November, sadly this was not as well attended as expected with only about 34 cars requiring parking, funds raised were \$137.20. The Maker's Market parking on 6 th November was certainly a very different scenario, and our guesstimate is that there at least 500 vehicle during our time assisting between 8.30am and 1.00pm. One of the volunteers from last year indicated that it was busier than the Christmas Market last year! We look forward to hearing the final figures from Applecross Rotary.

Bev had attended the ShelterBox Online Australian Champions Event on 25 th October and is pleased to advise that Attadale Rotary was the recipient of a Bronze award. ShelterBox will once again be holding a Giving Day on 9 th December, further details to be advised. Bev reminded everyone that the Booragoon Rotary Lift the Lid walk is to take place on Sunday 13 th November at Deep Water Point. Please refer the further information later in the Bulletin.

Jim and Jenny Calcie are hosting a Sundowner at their home in East Fremantle on Friday 11 th November from 5.30pm. If you were not at the meeting and intend going along, please let Jim and Jenny know.
