President's report for meeting held on 21 November 2022

We were delighted to Welcome Wayne Smith of Give a Feed and Ian de Nazareth of Foodbank to talk to us on Monday, with 19 attendees at the meeting. After wishing Selwyn a Happy Birthday with the customary cupcake and song, we enjoyed a delightful meal before hearing from our Guest Speakers. Ian gave an excellent overview of the challenges facing the less fortunate members of our community and the impacts of COVID and the increasing costs of living. Foodbank supports over 8000 people living with Food Insecurity each month, including provision of groceries to 380 WA frontline charities. They also fund the "Breakfast Club" which provides breakfast and fruit to more than 26,000 children in over 490 schools in WA. In fact, they have provided over 7.8 million meals to those doing it tough in WA this past year.

The demand has gone from 200 people per day requiring assistance prior to COVID, to over 800 currently requiring assistance. Many families cut back on food in order to pay their mortgages and bills, with 66% of the people using Foodbank being currently employed! Those are only the people who have acknowledged that they need help, there are likely to be many more.

Working with Foodbank, Wayne Smith is the co-founder of the Give a Feed programme. Some years ago, he made the decision to do more for those who are struggling, and after joining Heirisson Rotary, set about doing something about it. The Give a Feed programme is about providing a hamper of food to families, to enable them to celebrate Christmas. Along with the donations of food received and corporate sponsorship, the cost of each hamper is \$30.00, which feeds a family of 4. Funding is raised by donations, and packing of the hampers is done by volunteers. From starting off by delivering a humble 1000 hampers in the first year of operation, this has now increased with 3977 being delivered in 2021. If you are wondering what to give your loved ones for Christmas, how about donating a hamper on their behalf through Gift a Feed. Donations are welcomed at www.giveafeed.com.au. Bev also reminded those who had put their hands up to assist with parking, of their commitments. Please note that the Melville Community events' parking has subsequently been cancelled, and only those rostered on for the Makers' Market on 18 December will be required to assist.

A reminder to book your spot for the Christmas Dinner at the Parsons' home on 14 December was also mentioned, to ensure that sufficient time is provided to allow for catering purposes.

The door prize of a bottle of red wine was won by Rod Rate. Gail McCulloch was once again provided with the opportunity to draw the Joker, however she walked away with a consolation prize of a bottle of white wine, with the Joker still firmly entrenched in the pack. Many entertaining Happy Dollars were spent, courtesy of Colin MacCulloch - a man of many talents!! I suspect we should start calling him "The Entertainer" ...

The President's Language challenge continues, last week we learnt that the Portuguese way to say "Hello" is "Bom dia". Keeping things in the same region this week, we increase our vocabulary to include "Happy Birthday" in Spanish, which is "Feliz cumpleaños".

Rod Rate thanked the "Friends of Rotary" delivery to him and Yvonne, made by Ian and Jackie Pittaway, following his recent cycling mishap.

We ended the meeting with thanks to Selwyn for the provision of Sweet Treats to enjoy with tea, coffee and socialising after the meeting. We were also delighted to thank Wayne and Ian for attending our meeting and for their informative and heart-warming talks.



Bill Dempsey




Bill Dempsey has led a remarkable life. A member of the Stolen Generation, he overcame significant hardship to establish a fabulous Australian Rules playing career over 18 seasons as a player in Western Australia and the Northern Territory.

A member of the AFL's Indigenous Team of the Century, his life in football was celebrated earlier this year as the ambassador for Sir Doug Nicholls Round.

On top of that, Bill was inducted into the AFL Hall of Fame

Bill was a dominant player for West Perth over 17 seasons, playing in 343 games and 3 premiership teams, but what made that all the more remarkable was that for the first 10 seasons of his WAFL career, he returned home to Darwin every summer to play in the local competition for his beloved Buffaloes. He never enjoyed an off-season.

Bill's talk will centre around his current work as a mentor and role model for indigenous
