July 20 Guest Speaker: **DAVID ARCHIBALD** Topic: Anti Cancer Garden



Profile:

- In 1999 Mr Archibald was retained as an expert witness by the Austrian steel plant builder Voest Alpine in the Supreme Court of NSW in a patent dispute with Tippins over steel rolling mill technology. That same year, Mr Archibald was retained as an expert witness in the field of oil exploration by the Austrian oil company OMV in the Supreme Court of NSW in a dispute with Cultus Resources.
- In 2003 Mr Archibald co-authored a patent application on an anticancer formulation with Professor James Morre and Professor Dorothy Morre of Purdue University, Indiana.
- In 2012 Mr Archibald was appointed as a Visiting Fellow at the Institute of World Politics in Washington D.C., a graduate school for the CIA, State Department and Department of Defense.
- In 2011 Mr Archibald gave a lecture on climate science in a US Senate hearing room and was invited back in 2013 to give a lecture on climate science in a US House of Representatives hearing room.
- In 2014 Mr Archibald edited and published a book, *Hormones with Harmony*, on the role of phytoestrogens in modulating the human female hormone system. Also in 2014, Mr Archibald gave a presentation on climate science and geostrategic issues to the Tatarstan Academy of Sciences in Kazan, Tatarstan, Russia.
- In November 2015 the Swedish defence company Saab sent two of its executives to Perth to discuss fighter aircraft design with Mr Archibald.
- In 2016 Mr Archibald co-authored a paper, in *Evidence-Based Climate Science*, explaining how the gas planets (Jupiter, Saturn, Neptune and Uranus) control the solar cycle.
- In 2020, Mr Archibald published the first authoritative modern text on anticancer molecules available from plant species – *The Anticancer Garden in Australia*

For the last two years Mr Archibald has retained the services of a laboratory at Curtin University to perform *in vitro* and *in vivo* cancer research.



- Be an Australia Citizen





In 1988 a Rotarian and a group of Australian surgeons visited Fiji. Since then ROMAC has been providing surgical treatment in hospitals in Australia and New Zealand, for children from developing countries of the Southwest Pacific.
