

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I'm a little behind schedule this week in that the last two days have simply flown by after the meeting on Monday night and rather than immediately write this President's page, a replay of the final night of Master Chef got in the way. By the time Giovanna and I had watched the programme, it was too late to even think of Rotary and today has been a blur that included a meeting at The Trade Winds Hotel with Ian Pittaway and their Function's Manager.

# Mud Map, Directions, and Parking Options

Head west along Canning Highway towards Fremantle, through the Stirling Bridge traffic lights and you have two options.

1. Turn left into Sewell Street where there is street parking and also parking outside the Red Hot Design tee shirt place. There is an entry door into Tradewinds reception and function room from Sewell Street, **OR**
2. Turn left into Hubble Street, just past the hotel and park in street or park at the rear of the hotel.

If the gate is closed, just press the button to open the gate and park inside. Entry to the hotel is about just over half way along which leads you to the elevator to take down to first floor and function room.




## **PARKING OPTIONS FOR THE TRADEWINDS HOTEL**

# Avoid the Three Cs

Be aware of different levels of risk in different settings.



There are certain places where COVID-19 spreads more easily:



### Crowded places

*with many people nearby*




### Close-contact settings

*Especially where people have close-range conversations*



### Confined and enclosed spaces

*with poor ventilation*



The risk is higher in places where these factors overlap.

**Even as restrictions are lifted, consider where you are going and #StaySafe by avoiding the Three Cs.**
