FROM THE PRESIDENT

She then shared the range of offerings that Portcare provide including Opshop, Supermarket and — through connections with groups like Foodbank, 2nd Bite & Orange Sky — food vouchers for spending in their supermarket, showers & laundry facilities.

Ervina then espoused her vision for the future of Portcare and how she and Charlie want to grow it to become a true community including a café /meeting place where people can just hang out. They are unfortunately limited in this ambition due to being leaseholders, not owners of their premises.

Following Ervina we discussed the current Board Nominations and the Appointed Officer positions available for next year.

Colin spoke of the Christmas Dinner at the Parsons' home being funded by Kerry and Mal - with all proceeds going to the Parsons' Family Foundation project in the Philippines. He also mentioned the success of the Moombaki Show parking project which realised over \$3000, the upcoming Jacaranda Festival roster, and the sausage sizzle roster for 4th December.



The Role of Prison Chaplains and an Overview of Those We Serve

Martin will share some personal experiences of working as a Chaplain at Hakea Prison, which is a maximum-security prison for males located in Canning Vale. In speaking of his personal experiences, Martin will touch on the key characteristics of Western Australia's prison population and the part disadvantage plays in the lives of many prisoners.



MARTIN LONEY

Born in Narrogin, Martin is a 6th generation Western Australian whose family arrived on the "Sulphur" in 1829. He is a former Rotarian and past member of the Rossmoyne Rotary Club, with long careers in both Education and Healthcare. He works as a private Leadership Consultant and also coordinates Prison Chaplaincy for the Catholic Archdiocese of Perth. He and his wife Jackie are Ardross locals, and have been married for 45 years.

BUY slavery-free tea, coffee or chocolate with these three certification symbols on the labels: FAIRTRADE, Rainforest Alliance and UTZ.




