For more than two decades, Anne has committed her life to improving the lives of others. As the managing director of PlusLife, WA's not-for-profit bone and tissue bank, she has driven the establishment and the development of the charity.



From small beginnings, the former clinical nurse specialist is single-handedly credited with gathering an exemplary team of 24 medical specialists, scientists, technicians and administrative staff to help thousands of West Australians. Among those to have benefited include children and adolescents with spinal deformities, bone cancer patients and many others with joint disease caused by debilitating arthritis and trauma. Without Anne's dedication, many say the service would not have survived.

## GUEST SPEAKER – CAROL SHANNON

**“An investment in the youth’s future is an investment in our future.”**

The Leeuwin Foundation is a trusted not-for-profit organisation based in Fremantle. Since 1986 they have welcomed more than 40,000 young people onboard the STS Leeuwin II.

The Leeuwin Foundation is funded through a combination of grants, corporate sponsorships and donations by organisations and the general public. Rotary clubs across Western Australia have been extraordinary sponsors over the years, regularly topping up people’s voyage fares.

Their primary program is the Youth Explorer Voyages, a week-long opportunity designed for young people aged from 14 to 25 (although older participants with a sense of adventure can also apply) to sharpen their work-ready skills and enhance skills in communication, leadership and collaboration.

Participants are inspired and given opportunities to try completely new things. They are not taught to sail -- the aim is giving and receiving instructions, listening, taking challenges, accountability, responsibility. They do, however, make sure everyone understands how ships work – safety instructions, emergency drills, ship hierarchy, watching out for their mates, and that it’s okay to feel sick. Learning to step out of their comfort zone and work together gives them a sense of achievement.

Next year, their Future Connect voyage will have 20 Western Australians from a refugee background and 20 Western Australian youth raised in WA to come together through adventure, exploration and discovery that will encourage greater community connections and understanding.

There are so many challenges facing young people these days and giving them opportunities to build confidence, courage, resilience, personal development and leadership will provide key life skills that they will take into their studies, careers and community.

For those choosing to be in the honour guard, we will assemble outside the chapel and form two lines either side of the casket as it comes through. - **Lift the Lid on Mental Illness: Young Minds Matter** – attended a combined District 9455 and 9465 Mental Health Seminar/Conference focused on children held at UWA. One in 7 children suffer from some degree of mental health and there are higher rates with break-ups and unemployment in the family. A strong factor is what other kids think and early presentation and early intervention are the keys in helping overcome this problem. Some Rotary Clubs currently pledge money and support this project. More information will be gathered for the club to see how we can also help.
- **Qantas Blankets** – an email has come from our District Governor Robyn in conjunction with Charles Johnson DG of 9455. Qantas, working with Rotary, is donating its old blankets for distribution to the homeless and others in need this winter. The distribution of the blankets is a joint initiative of the two Rotary Districts in WA. If we could take this offer up, it would be great, but it will have to be a team effort with one or two co-ordinators.

**If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.**

The **set up** and **pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig, President's dais with Chain of Office, two bottles of wine and a gift coaster for the Guest Speaker
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the Sergeant or President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
