








Charter Meeting of the Rotary Club of Attadale

On April 12th, 1982, the Rotary Club of Attadale held its Charter Meeting with 33 members. We have two of those Charter members still active in our Club today.

They are **Mal Bennett** and **Winston Marsh**, who will share some memories of those early days.

Mal Bennett

Mal took us back to the 1980's, when he left Apex. He was talking to a number of men who lived close by, including, Don Williams, who said they were thinking of starting a Rotary Club in Attadale. They put the word around and had their first unofficial meeting in late 1981.

In conjunction with Gordon Cargeeg from the Rotary Club of Melville they ran with it and held a few other unofficial meetings and the number of interested people grew.

It was decided to make the meeting on April 12, 1982 at the Raffles Hotel, the first official meeting.

Don Williams (the instigator) was the President and Alan Morcombe the Vice President, President Elect was Max Anderson, the Secretary was Tom Leach, the Treasurer was Doug West, and the Sergeant at Arms was Don Rodger

One of the great things about the early days was that everyone lived fairly close. This enabled progressive dinners to be held at least once a year.

Some of the other highlights of our fundraising was the Swan River Marathon that was held a number of times, in the late 80's and early 90's. The one held in 1987 (the Year of the America's Cup) had a lot of America's Cup teams involved.

They were great community events and attracted very good sponsors.

Another highlight for Mal was the celebration of 100 Years of Rotary in the year that he was President. It was celebrated over two days at the Convention Centre with all Rotary Clubs involved.

In the 100th year the Rotary International President Glenn Estess Sr. wanted the wealthier Clubs of the world to contact a sister Club in the Third World countries and help them with education, health issues etc. The Rotary Club Attadale became a Sister Club of the Rotary Club of Mount Everest.

Today we are still involved with helping Nepal through In Giving We Receive (IGWR) with a Quiz Night.

In 2005, eight members and partners from the Rotary Club of Attadale travelled to Nepal to meet the officials of the Sister Club. They were there for Rotary's International Polio Vaccination Day.

Back in Australia a dinner was organised to raise money for ABC Nepal. Mal thought about \$40 000 was raised.

Another memorable event was the formal night at the East Fremantle Yacht Club to celebrate the 25th Birthday of the Rotary Club of Attadale.

Over the years we have enjoyed weekends away and hopefully will get to enjoy more.

The Charter Presentation Dinner was held on Saturday, 12 June, 1982 at the Raffles Hotel.

Winston was also a member of Apex and looked forward to joining Rotary as it offered him the opportunity to meet a different group of people from those he met through his pharmacy.

As Community Director he started the Probus Club of Attadale which was the Attadale Men's Club in 1982, and it is still going today.

When ladies were introduced into Probus we started the Attadale Ladies Probus Club and that has just recently joined with Applecross. Winston was instrumental in starting a number of Probus Clubs.

Rotary Friendship programmes ran for three or four years. We would put two or three ads in the community service paper for people who were lonely. They would write into Rotary and we would collect their letters. After two or three weeks we would change the ad in the paper, asking people to write in, if they would like to befriend the lonely people. We would match up people and it worked well.

Winston was pleased with the Job Seeker Seminar we ran with Santa Marie College. A motivator was employed and Rotarians would give job talks. This was very beneficial for the school and the students.

The WA Department of Health recommends that the following behaviours should be promoted:
