



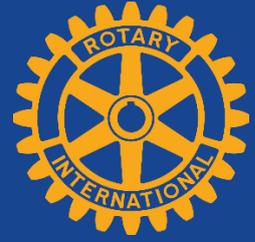

Interplast

Rotary was involved in the establishment of Interplast in 1983 with the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons.

Interplast is supported by Rotarians, in clubs and districts throughout Australia and New Zealand. A central thread throughout the organisation, Rotarians are equal members of the Company, have equal representation on the Board of Directors and form the Rotarian Committee, which advises the Executive and Board on Rotary matters.

Interplast sends teams of volunteer plastic and reconstructive surgeons, anaesthetists, nurses and allied health professionals to provide free medical treatment, life changing surgery and medical training to the local medical staff, in seventeen countries across the Asia Pacific region.

Since 1983, Rotarians have raised significant funds to support Interplast in repairing bodies and rebuilding lives.

Many Rotarians have accompanied teams as observers and have returned to act as ambassadors of Interplast, by spreading their word, voicing their experiences and sharing their secret.

Each member of an Interplast programme is fully qualified in their field of expertise and VOLUNTEER their time to participate in an Interplast programme.

Interplast volunteers provide free treatment to people living with a disability from a congenital condition, such as cleft lip and palate, or an acquired condition such as burn scar contractures.

Treatment is targeted to the indigent population, who would otherwise not be able to afford to access services.

Interplast assist with developing local capacity to provide plastic and reconstructive surgery services, by providing training and mentoring programs for medical and allied health professionals.

All Interplast programmes are training programs — leaving a legacy long after the team has gone.

Marie's passion for the ongoing potential of the Rotary/Interplast partnership was evident and I am sure will be realised.

Marie's interesting, informative, thought provoking. and heartfelt presentation was appreciated by us all.

The RYLA camp will be held in January from 16th - 23rd January 2021. They have put together the facilitator team, and will be opening applications soon.



COVID-19

The WA Department of Health recommends that the following behaviours should be promoted:

- practice good respiratory and hand hygiene
- wash hands regularly with soap and water for 20 - 30 seconds, or use an alcohol-based hand rub
- wash your hands before and after eating
- don't touch your face
- cough or sneeze into your elbow or a tissue and dispose of used tissues immediately
- hand hygiene after coughing, sneezing or blowing nose

Practise social distancing;

- **and stay home if you are unwell:** even if you don't think you could have COVID-19

We are following the current WA Department of Health recommendations which we feel are the most reliable for our circumstances.

The Prime Minister has announced,

'ALL arrivals to Australia from overseas will to be forced to self-isolate for 14 days, this is effective from midnight Sunday 15 March 2020.'
