President Colin welcomed our guest speaker, Craig Rothleitner, special guest, Fiona Jensen, and all members.

Colin presented **Patricia, Bev** and **Mal** with candle-lit cakes to wish them all a very happy birthday.

He then outlined all of the exciting things happening and who would give presentations.

Colin then took great pleasure in announcing that we had secured an exemption from having to pay Transfer Duty on the purchase of the block of land for the Rotary Charity House.

The Transfer Duty was \$9,405 so this is a huge saving for the Club and means the profit from the Rotary Charity House will be that much greater.

School of St Yared

Colin made special thanks to **James Doogue** who had recently travelled to Ethiopia to visit the school of St Yared and meet all those involved in our project there. James is a relatively new member and he has grasped all the intricacies involved and had a very successful and productive visit.

John Sharp is flying out to Ethiopia this Friday to follow on from James's visit. He hopes to finalise all of the outstanding issues and paperwork and build on the relationships established by James.

The Rotary Foundation has given verbal approval for the re-worked Memorandum of Understanding with our partner club, the Rotary Club of Addis Ababa Bole, and John will be able to get this signed off.

Guest Speaker ~ Craig Rothleitner

Martin had great pleasure introducing Craig Rothleitner, the Director of 'Stormwater Technologies'.

Craig is an inventor, former mechanic and rigger.

He has invested \$1.6 million and 6½ years developing a product that will remove "the garbage" from metropolitan drains.

Mr Rothleitner said his TemFlow device stops a big percentage of anaerobic waste and harmful nutrients entering main waterways, such as the Swan River, via urban drains.



He thought his device could separate the rubbish from stormwater, including vegetative waste, sand and sediment in the drainage network.

Craig spoke to Rob Willis who invented the side entry pit for stormwater drains over 40 years ago in collaboration with other people.


Mr Willis gave Mr Rothleitner access to drains in Subiaco for 12 months to carry out tests. A year later, he called a live test in front of ministers, The Department of Water, Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia and councils. Since then he hasn't looked back

Mr Rothleitner would like to see drains around key water bodies fitted with TemFlow units this summer to stop a "huge" amount of waste entering the river next winter.

It was a very thought-provoking talk. We would all like to see the many benefits that would flow on from his ideas.

Microbat boxes ready for production

Brian Taylor of the Bicton Men's Shed has produced a prototype of the microbat roosting boxes that we are going to provide through our project "Microbats and Minimizing the Mozzie Menace in Melville". He did a fine job and the Men's Shed are now going to do a production run of fifty boxes to start.

The box featured opposite will be painted to protect the wood and help it blend into the natural surroundings when it is installed.

The boxes will be allowed to age before being distributed in early spring.

The boxes will have galvanized trim to prevent cockatoos chewing the wood in their efforts to enlarge the entry.

They will have carpet on the underside of the roof to discourage bees from moving in.

They will also have reflective tape on the edge of the underside of the roof so that it will be easier to see the outlines of the microbats when they take up residence.



We are developing a dedicated website telling people all about microbats and mosquito control and where and how they can get bat boxes. Anyone with experience using Word Press is asked to contact Colin as he would like a bit of tutoring.







If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the Australian flag(s), the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig, President's dais with Chain of Office, two bottles of wine and a gift coaster for the Guest Speaker
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables and the large flag shall be appropriately displayed
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphone provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Program Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the Sergeant or President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
