

Jeff's Update on the Murdoch Student Emerging Leaders Program (MSEL)

MSEL is focused on helping students expand their capabilities and reach their potential while empowering them to deliver high calibre projects for community organisations.

Last Monday the students held their last session on 'Interviews' with the students at Melville Senior High School. Jeff felt it was the best session out of the three that have been held.

They had very positive feedback from the participating students, staff and Rotarians.

Guest Speaker Tracy Vo ~ 'Her Story'

Martin had great pleasure introducing **Tracy Vo**, who began a journalism career in radio, reporting for 6PR Radio and Curtin FM 100.1, while completing a Bachelor of Arts degree at Curtin University.

In 2004, she moved east and worked in radio as a breakfast editor, newsreader and reporter.

Tracy then moved into television. First at Sky News Australia then Channel Ten and finally Channel Nine.

She has worked as a political reporter with many well-known identities including political editor Laurie Oakes and has covered a wide range and some of the biggest stories in Australia and overseas.

Tracy was a delight to listen to as she related the story of how her parents escaped Vietnam on a boat in 1978, shortly after the Vietnam War, as well as her childhood as a first-generation Australian.

She said her parents were among the lucky ones as they were given immediate approval by Australian authorities to resettle in Perth. They integrated into the local community and worked very hard. Often her father would work two jobs — one during the day and another at night — to make ends meet.

Her mother got a job in a meat-packing warehouse and the couple later started their own catering business. Mrs Vo became known for her wedding cakes.

Tracy says she's always known her parents were brave. "Building a life in Australia — it isn't easy and there have been tough times in our family, but they have always taught us to get by and you always come out the other end eventually."

Tracy suffered from bullying at primary school where some classmates singled her out and told her she had dark, ugly skin. She remembers going home from school one day and trying to scrub her arms to make her skin lighter. She says it had a devastating effect on her. However, things improved at high school where she did well and made long lasting friendships.

In 2014, Tracy became a published author, telling her family's story in a book she's written called Small Bamboo, which she dedicated to Peter Harvey who was a great mentor. She hopes her book will help break down cultural barriers and also help inspire children from other cultures who may be having a tough time.

Tracy's talk was very interesting and enlightening. It was thoroughly enjoyed by all who warmed to her delightful personality.

If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the Australian flag(s), the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig, President's dais with Chain of Office, two bottles of wine and a gift coaster for the Guest Speaker
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables and the large flag shall be appropriately displayed
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphone provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Program Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the Sergeant or President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
