The meeting will be held on Wednesday, January 24 starting at 6.30pm.

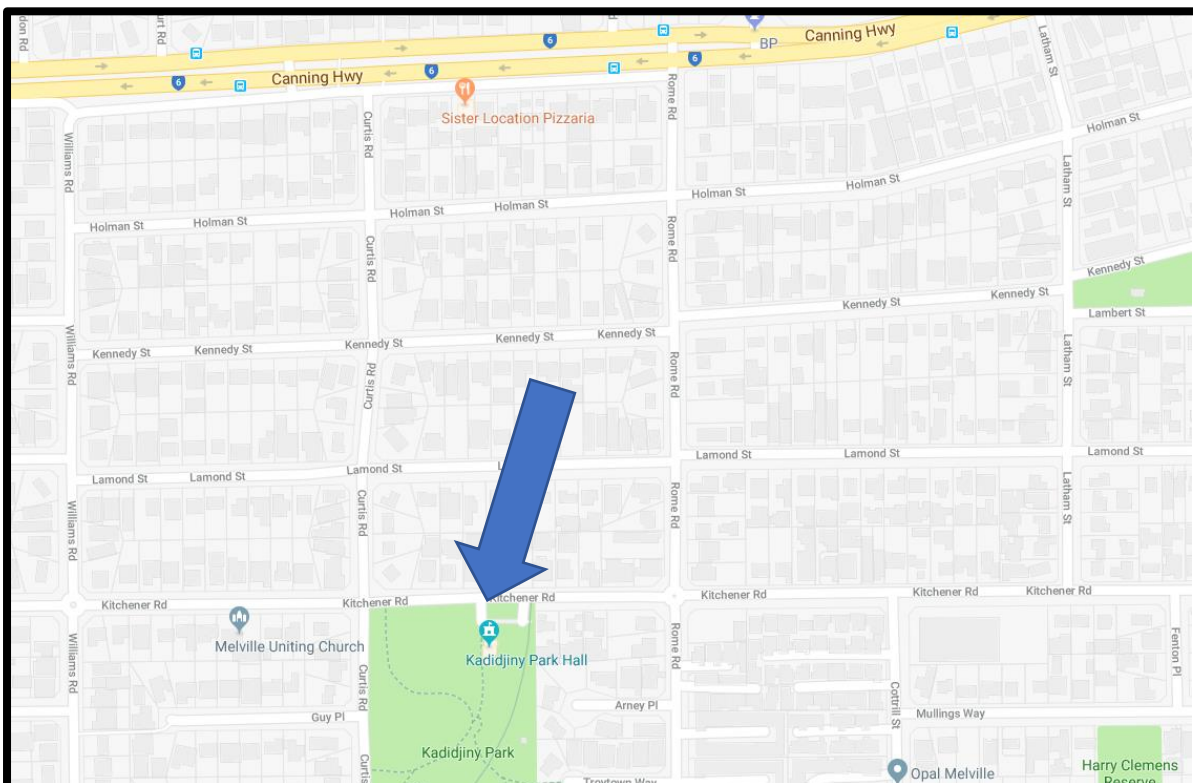
The venue is the meeting hall at Kadidjiny Park on the corner of Kitchener & Curtis Roads, Melville.

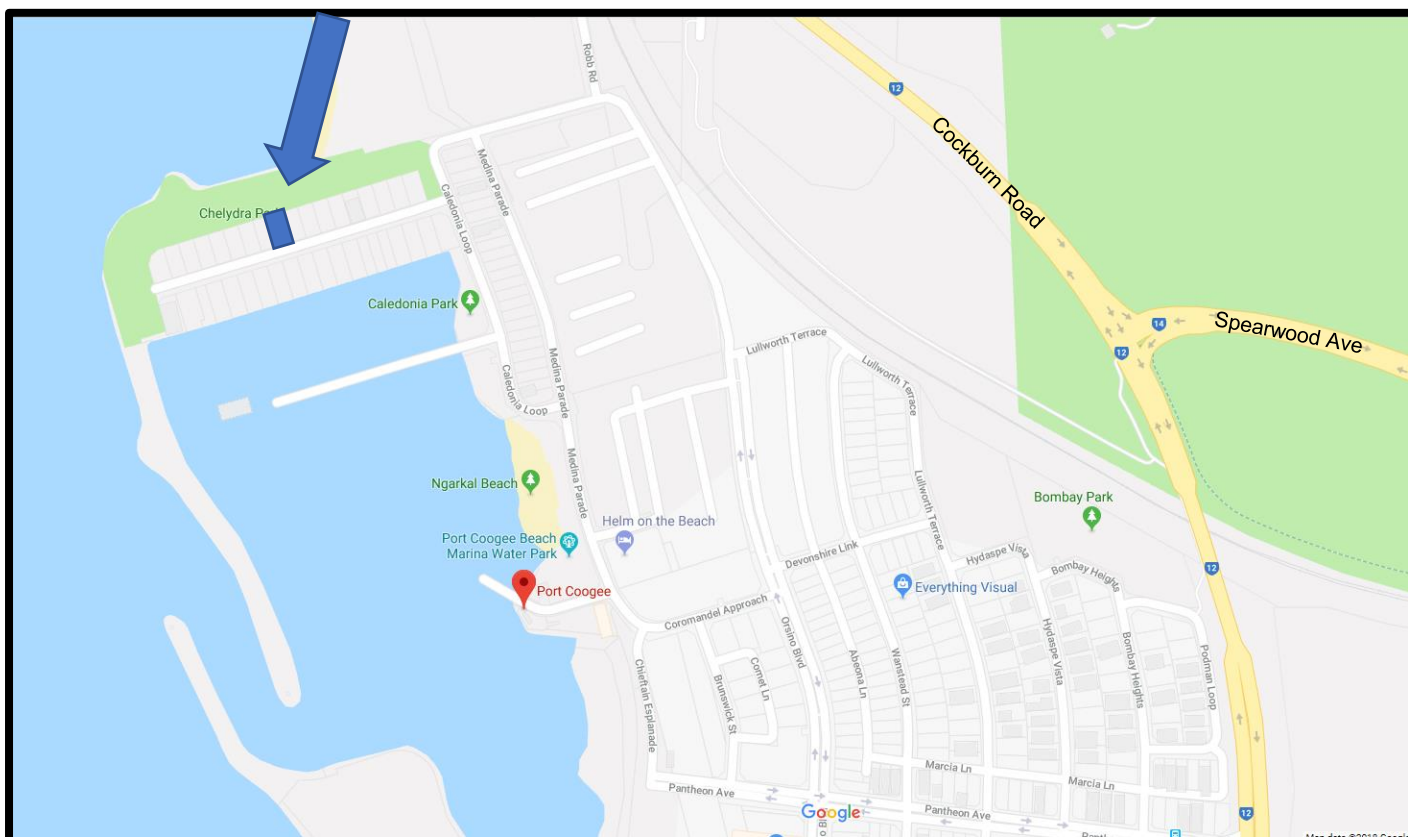


AUSTRALIA DAY SUNDOWNER

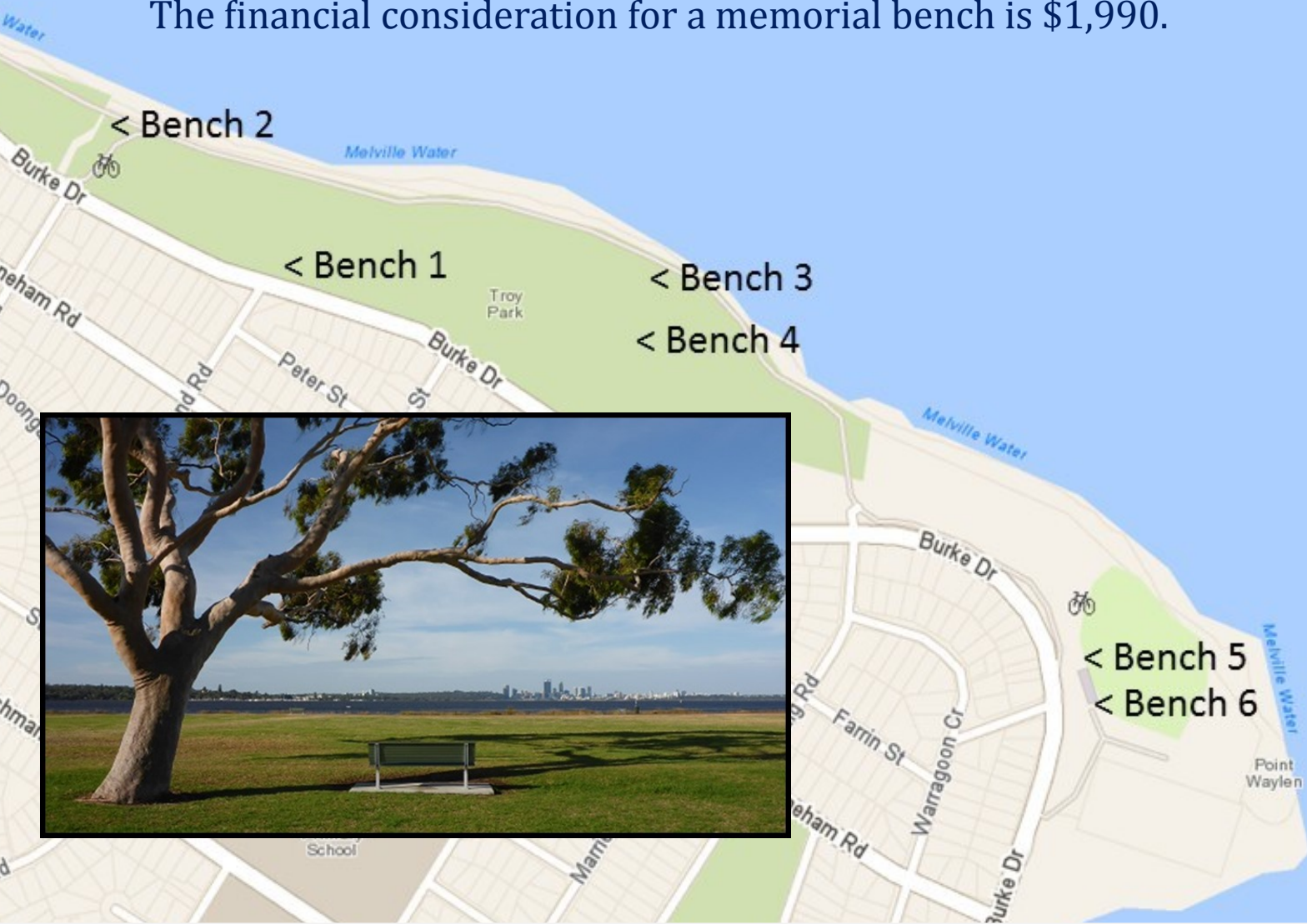
