

The money raised will go to help the work **In Giving We Receive** (IGWR) are doing in Nepal where they are currently making a difference to the lives of about 70 children - from toddlers to teenagers.



They rent three houses and employ house mothers, so that children can live safely and healthily.

Often their families live more than a day's journey away from a school and the only way the children can obtain an education is by leaving home.

They provide support to three schools - by paying teachers' salaries, providing supplies, and giving lunches to children who would otherwise not eat at school.

Their main focus is on working with families to support their children while they obtain an education.

They have been improving the school buildings and facilities for the children who are all keen and eager to learn.



Plant a tree

Rotary International President **Ian Riseley** has challenged all 1.2 million Rotarians to plant a tree.

On Wednesday June 20 members of the Rotary Club of Attadale are going to plant 300 trees.

Start time for next Wednesday is 9.00 am

The location is along Honour Avenue on the left after the roundabout near the golf club, towards the Point.

The trees will be provided and the holes will be pre-dug. Members may want to bring their own gloves.

We will be working with the Bicton Environmental Action Group and president Peter Neesham who are organising the planting. Depending upon the number of volunteers it should take us about two hours.

GUEST SPEAKER

Kerry Parsons had great pleasure introducing Yared and sharing with the meeting how he and Abby had travelled to Addis Ababa in Ethiopia to visit the school. They were very impressed by Yared and the whole project and wanted to help them achieve their goals.

Kerry put forward the idea to build a Rotary Charity House, which was done. The proceeds were used to obtain a Global Grant which is now being used to assist with the re-location, refurbishment and expansion of the school.

Yared Wolde

Co-founder of The School of St Yared

Yared told us that the school was established in 2009 with the vision of giving the best opportunities to those children who would otherwise not get to school due to extreme poverty, poor health and family circumstance.

He spoke about the process used to select children to attend the school.

The children receive two healthy meals plus a snack at the school each day, as well as school uniforms, essential learning materials and access to extra-curricular activities.



With education, the plan is for these children to grow into self-sufficient young adults and become the future leaders of their community. Through education, they are planning to break the poverty cycle.

Previously we have heard about Yared's childhood and his dream to help educate children. He is to be admired for what he has and continues to achieve.



Palmyra Family Meals Project

The Rotary Club of Attadale is very pleased to be involved with the Palmyra Family Meals Project with **Sky Manua** and his family who will do the preparation and cooking.

The first meals were distributed to 14 needy families on May 25.

Foodbank is going to provide most of the ingredients and the preparation will be done in the Palmyra School canteen that meets all necessary health requirements.

The Rotary Club of Attadale is providing the disposable food-grade containers that will provide for 20 to 25 weeks of meals.

This is a much-needed community service and we applaud **Sky Manua** and his family for doing it.

The Starlight Hotel Choir is their community choir whose members have experienced homelessness, hardship and mental health issues at some stage in their lives.


The choir lifts the spirit of these people and gives them a sense of belonging'.

Accommodation

St. Pat's offer a range of accommodation for families, adults and young people, from individual dwellings to lodging house accommodation and are either short, medium or long-term arrangements.

Crisis short-term accommodation is also available, as are opportunities for transitional 'rented' accommodation options through their housing services.

Meals

Volunteers provide free daily breakfasts and subsidised lunches in the client dining room.



Community Support Centre

They also have a self-serve café style courtyard, movie room, billiards, computer centre and library.

The Day Centre also provides emergency relief services including: food hampers, showers, clean towels, toiletries and clothing for those who find themselves with nowhere else to go.

- Health promotion activities




Gail and Tracey in the Dental Clinic

Rod had great pleasure presenting a cheque for \$22,693.


The Rotary Club of Fremantle join with us in running this event and they present a cheque to the Spinnaker Health Research Foundation.





Countdown to History

District 9465 is happy to help



District 9465 would like to donate US\$ 5,000.00 in 2017-18 District Designated Funds (DDF) to PolioPlus. Every dollar of DDF will be matched 50% by The Rotary Foundation's World Fund, up to US\$5.0Million.

Every US\$1 Rotary commits to direct support for polio immunization will be matched 2 to 1 (up to US\$50 million per year) by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation through 2020.

Donate **\$2,000 DDF** and it **becomes \$9,000**. Donate **\$10,000 DDF** and it **becomes \$45,000**.

Recognition

Districts donating 20% or more in DDF to PolioPlus will receive a special certificate each year they qualify. Districts that qualify from 2013-14 until eradication is achieved will be recognized on a plaque displayed at RI World Headquarters.



If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig, President's dais with Chain of Office, two bottles of wine and a gift coaster for the Guest Speaker
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the Sergeant or President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
