


Members and friends are invited on a special Club visit to the Lawrence Wilson Gallery at UWA to view Stewart Scambler's exhibition entitled "Fragment".




GUEST SPEAKER

Rod had great pleasure introducing his very good friends **Peter** and **Barbara Browne** to the meeting. **Rod** told us that not only is **Peter** a good bloke, with a lot of business experience he has the highest ethical standards.

Peter was educated in the Goldfields of WA, Scotch College, Grayland's Teachers' College, where he was the Student Guild President, and Curtin University.

He spent many years as a teacher and administrator in rural Western Australia, was the inaugural Principal of Cunderdin Agricultural College before being appointed Superintendent, Executive Director, CEO of the Department of Education Services and subsequently Director General of Education.

After Peter Browne retired as Director General of Education he was appointed Adjunct Professor at Curtin University with responsibility for establishing and enhancing campuses in rural Western Australia. He subsequently spent ten years as Education Consultant to BHP Billiton focusing on education in the Pilbara.

Peter related many interesting stories of his experiences and initiatives while working for BHP in the Pilbara.

One of the major problems was getting children to attend school each day. A wide range of incentives were put in place to

entice the children to attend but sadly the desired results were often not long lasting.

Peter certainly implemented a wide range of ideas in many communities in the Pilbara and is to be congratulated on the work he did there.

Peter then shared with us some of the many and varied positions he has held. He chaired the Country High School Hostels Authority, the Education Endowment Trust, was on the Board of St Mary's Girls School, Deputy Chair of John Walliston College, a member of the Senate of UWA and the Governing Council of Curtin University.

He chaired the establishment of the Margaret River Centre of Wine Excellence and the establishment of WACOT

Peter conducted numerous reviews for the State Government including Scitech, PCYC Governance and Road Safety in WA.

He is a serving JP and Deputy Mayor of the Claremont Town Council

Peter has devoted most of his life to the advancement of rural education.

He was an entertaining and informative speaker and a delight to listen to.

Fiona Stanley Hospital Visit



Sky explained that he and his family do all the planning, purchasing, cooking and packaging of meals for needy families.

Foodbank provide most of the ingredients at a reduced cost and the preparation is done in the Palmyra School canteen that meets all necessary health requirements.

The Rotary Club of Attadale is very pleased to be assisting **Sky** and **May Manua** with the Palmyra Family Meals Project by providing all of the food-quality takeaway containers for 20 to 25 weeks of meals. If needed we can also contribute by helping with the food costs.

This is a much-needed community service and we applaud **Sky Manua** and his family for doing it.

Sky explained about their visa difficulties and that they have been given 28 days to leave Australia. This certainly struck a chord with our members and many approached them after the meeting to offer assistance.

They are a wonderful family and we wish them all the best for the future.

Rotary International President **Ian Riseley** has challenged all 1.2 million Rotarians to plant a tree.


On Wednesday eight of our members planted 250 Banksia trees at Point Walter.

If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig, President's dais with Chain of Office, two bottles of wine and a gift coaster for the Guest Speaker
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
 - Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
 - Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
 - Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
 - Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
 - Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
 - Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
 - Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the Sergeant or President
 - Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
 - Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
 - Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
 - Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
