Guest Speaker ~Professor Mike Daube

Rod had great pleasure introducing **Professor Mike Daube** as the man who has been arguably the most influential Campaigner for Health in the history of this state.

This was acknowledged on June 2nd this year when the Governor announced **Mike Daube** as the: -

2018 West Australian Citizen of the Year.

Terry Slavin, the Director of Education and Research at The Cancer Council of WA wrote an article about **Mike Daube** which was published on the AMA website.

Terry said that he had asked many souls who had worked with Mike about their views of **Mike Daube**, they all shared a common theme.

'Mike Daube Drives Me Nuts'

They all spoke highly of **Mike** and his approach to the task at hand, using words like relentless, effective, control freak, frighteningly good connections, responsive, doesn't have an off switch.

Mike spoke to the meeting about his health work nationally and globally, particularly his role in developing anti-tobacco policies that have contributed to a decline in smoking rates worldwide.

He said being a campaigner had been a hard and at times unsafe road, with a lot of opposition, but people were listening and change was happening.

Mike has tackled some of the toughest issues including tobacco policy and reform and his leadership has really changed the face of tobacco products in an area where Australia is a world leader."

He helped toughen up tobacco control and pushed for tobacco advertising bans and plain cigarette packaging.

Mike said, there was more to do but when he looks back at how far we've come, the changes to packaging, the laws around smoking in public and the decline in smoking, it was remarkable.

His next step was to focus on changes to tobacco laws in developing countries and hoped his award would show the need and importance of campaigning for change.

He said seven million people around the world die each year as a result from smoking so we still have a long way to go.

He said we need more committed campaigners and would love to see more young people campaigning, and more academics playing a role in public debate.

Mike's talk was very enlightening and extremely interesting. His expertise and passion in a wide range of health issues is amazing.

The health of Western Australians and Australians has been improved immeasurably because of his unrelenting campaign on a range of medical issues

All the details are below and it sounds like a very entertaining production.



If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig, President's dais with Chain of Office, two bottles of wine and a gift coaster for the Guest Speaker
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
 - Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
 - Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
 - Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
 - Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
 - Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
 - Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
 - Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the Sergeant or President
 - Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
 - Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
 - Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
 - Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
-
