

Ian attended a combined meeting with the Rotary Clubs of Willetton and Canning where he heard entrants in the 4 Way Test Speech Contest. The other Clubs had chosen their entrants and Ian had the opportunity to ask **Erin** to be our entrant.

The Zone 3 Semi Finals will be held at Rossmoyne Senior High School on Tuesday, 24 September at 6.00pm for 6.30pm. Everyone is welcome to come and hear five of our State's future leaders.

**Erin** was invited to present her five to six-minute talk, titled '**Hugo Throssell, VC**'.

She spoke very well about the qualities needed by those who fought in wars and in particular about Hugo Throssell, the son of the former Premier of Western Australia, George Throssell. Hugo joined the 10th Light Horse Regiment, Australian Imperial Force in 1914.

In 1915 he was awarded the Victoria Cross which is the highest and most prestigious award for gallantry in the face of the enemy, that can be awarded.

Everyone enjoyed **Erin's** talk, and we wish her all the best when she competes in the Zone 3 Semi Finals.

## Guest Speaker

### Jeff Spickett ~ 'A Kimberley Coastline'

**Jeff and Evadne** enjoyed a 21-day cruise from Darwin to Broome aboard the *Kimberley Quest* in March this year.

They thoroughly enjoyed the life on board and all the activities on offer. Jeff enjoyed catching good eating fish.

On the journey they were impressed with all the colours of the water and surrounding landscape. They saw numerous spectacular waterfalls, including King George Falls, climbed cliffs to swim in beautiful freshwater pools. saw ancient rock art, crocodiles, turtles, sharks, mud crabs and birdlife.


Montgomery Reef, was an amazing sight. The reef, which covers an area of about 400 square kilometres, rises out of the water as the tide falls, creating a waterfall, allowing water to run and cascade down its channels and back into the ocean.

In Talbot Bay, they experienced the spectacular Horizontal Falls. The fast-moving tidal current squeezes through two narrow gorges of the McLarty Range, pushing the water into rapid - like formations which rush through the twin gaps at an astonishing rate, producing waterfalls turned on their side. The powerful tides in the Kimberley can reach more than 10 metres and the direction of the flow reverses, ensuring the water flows two different ways each day.

Across the salt pans at Vansittart Bay they saw the wreck of a DC3 plane that crashed in 1942 during World War II, and heard that all aboard had survived.

The photos Jeff shared with us showed just how spectacular the Kimberley area is. He brought back fond memories for some and had others thinking about going to see it all for themselves.



**If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.**

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig and sign, Joker container and two bottles of wine.
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
