Board Report

- Over the years, decisions on Policy and Procedure have been made. To ensure these are all in one place and accessible, all past Presidents have been asked to submit that information, from their year in office, to **Martin**, who has very kindly taken on the job of collating it all.

- We have been addressing the problem of paying out a lot of money for meals that are ordered but not used. The Record of Leave Book is making a positive difference with this issue. To make the job of the Attendance officer easier we ask that you **write** the dates you will be away in the Record of Leave Book.
If you can't do that, we would like you to let the Attendance officer know in **writing** when you will be away. This way there is a written record that can be referred to.
- We are going to trial a text reminder system to be used as well. Thank you to **Martin** for setting this up.
- **Cathy Day** from the Melville City Council, contacted **Colin** see if the Rotary Club of Attadale would be interested in managing the parking at community events. This would be a great way to earn some money.
- We are going to change our International Pig collection to a money box that raises money for a little 2-year-old girl, named **Matilda** who is battling Sanfilippo Syndrome, a rare genetic condition, that causes fatal brain damage. It's a type of childhood dementia and most sufferers never reach adulthood. The South Side Symphony Orchestra held their annual fund-raising event to raise money for research into this disease.
- We are looking at the Project Head Phones for Dementia and finding there are a lot of issues that need to be considered, before we can commit to taking it on, so inquiries are continuing.
- A few years ago, we placed memorial benches along the Burke Drive foreshore walkways. We have had two people apply for plaques to be placed on them

Guest Speaker ~Leif Cocks from Curtin University 'Orangutan Research Project'

The Orangutan Project was established in 1998 by founder and world-renowned orangutan expert, Leif Cocks, as a result of his almost 30-year career working with orangutans. Leif is a passionate campaigner for orangutans and has been the President of The Orangutan Project since its inception.

Leif's years in the field have earned him respect within the conservation field. He has been a key player in developing conservation plans for orangutans and influencing positive change for orangutan protection and survival. This includes the first ever successful reintroduction of a zoo-born orangutan. This respect has given The Orangutan Project world standing in conservation.

A small population biologist and curator by trade; Leif has several academic qualifications, including a Master's of Science studying orangutans. He lectures at universities, is a seasoned public speaker and has published several papers on orangutans in peer-reviewed journals. Leif is also the author of the books *Orangutans and their Battle for Survival* (2002) and, Amazon best seller, *Orangutans My Cousins, My Friends* (2016) - A journey to understand and save the person of the forest.

Leif is currently a Technical Advisor for PT Alama Bukit Tigapuluh (a company leasing and protecting rainforest), President of International Elephant Project, President of International Tiger Project, Vice President of Orang Utan Republik Foundation and on the Advisor Board for Forest, Nature and Environment of Aceh.

Leif's talk encouraged us to think of a world where we work to make it a better place for all living things.







If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig and sign, Joker container and two bottles of wine.
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
