2019 AUSTRALIAN OF THE YEAR

Dr Craig Challen SC OAM

Join us for an inspiring presentation with one of the 2019 Australians of the Year, Dr Craig Challen SC OAM, to hear his engaging and extraordinary story of courage, leadership and teamwork in helping to save the lives of a school sporting team.

Craig, along with anaesthetist Dr Richard Harris, were recognised as joint 2019 Australians of the Year for their heroic efforts to save 12 boys and their soccer coach from flooded caves in Thailand last year.

Originally from Western Australia, Craig is a technical diver and cave explorer, and previously worked as a veterinarian. He has set depth records in diving, including diving to 194m in the Pearse Resurgence, New Zealand in 2011, and in 2009, he was awarded Technical Diver of the Year at the Australian technical diving conference, Oztek.

Both Craig and Richard were awarded the Star of Courage for unwavering and selfless bravery following the successful rescue of the trapped soccer team.

Guest Speakers ~ Erik and Kerry Anderson 'Mercy Ships

We were delighted to welcome Erik, his wife Kerry and daughter Jessica Anderson to our meeting and hear their amazing story.

Erik had worked on the Africa Mercy ship a number of times, when the whole family were inspired to go together.

At any given time during its nearly 40-year history, Mercy Ships has had between 1 and 3 ships in service. Currently, the *Africa Mercy* is the only Mercy Ship in service, but it represents greater capacity than all prior hospital ships combined

It is the largest non-governmental hospital ship in the world

The hospital includes five operating theatres, recovery, intensive care, and low dependency wards.



Africa Mercy

Erik is an anaesthetist working at the Perth Children's Hospital. As there is a massive shortage of anaesthetic practitioners in Guinea, **Erik** was asked to join the team to help with training to improve morbidity/mortality during operations in Guinea, as well as working as an anaesthetist in the Mercy Ship's operating theatres

Kerry is a dietician and was invited to come and use her skills in the areas where paediatric or adult patients needed to improve their nutritional status.

Kerry shared with us stories and pictures of the mal nourished babies who required cleft palate surgery.

They were excited to have this adventure as a family and join the ship to bring hope and healing in a world of suffering, shame and hopelessness as a result of surgically correctable diseases.

The family lived aboard, in a cabin which measured eight by six metres. While her parents were at work, Jessica attended school on board. Her classmates were the children of other crew members from all over the globe.

The mission of Mercy Ships is to make access to safe and affordable surgery, a reality for those in extreme poverty, and to help train medical professionals to continue the work after the ship departs.

Each year around 1 000 volunteers from up to 49 nations serve with the Mercy Ships. Professionals like surgeons, dentists, nurses, healthcare trainers, teachers, cooks, seamen, engineers donate their time and skills to the effort.

We were all in awe of the commitment this family have to improve the lives of others and to hear about this wonderful organisation that relies on volunteers and donations to operate.

Reports


Colin introduced **Yasmine Riddler** and **Joshua Rigby** to the meeting.







If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig and sign, Joker container and two bottles of wine.
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
