### Love in a Shoe Box



## **Slide Show**

**Colin** presented a slide show of **In Giving We Receive (IGWR)** during our meal.

**Guest Speaker ~ Gareth Parker ~  
Journalist and Radio Presenter ~**

***'Letting Our Kids Down ~ How Adults Fuel Climate of Fear'***

The most polarising public issue in the western world at the moment is ~ 'human induced climate change and what we do about it'.

Gareth believes this is a real problem and we need to figure out what to do about it. There are a whole range of possibilities, some have costs, some have benefits and trying to work out the right way forward is very difficult.

He spoke about the recent student climate change protest in Perth. There were about 10 000 school children, parents and supporters in Forrest Place. To their credit they protested peacefully, delivered their message and went on about their business.

Gareth interviewed, a spokesperson for the protest, fifteen-year-old student, Siobhan Sutton, from Perth Modern School. During the interview Gareth observed that she was really stressed and anxious. Siobhan said that there is a global climate crisis. That it is urgent, and it is going to kill people in the short term. She said that governments and big corporations are not just doing nothing in a neutral way, she believes they are doing nothing in a harmful, malevolent way.

Gareth asked her what the students do, to try an influence this problem. She diverted back to her previous claims about governments and corporations not doing anything.

Gareth put to her, what she could do, within her control, e.g. like substituting trips to school in Mum's car with a bike or bus or how well did she recycle in her home?

The fact that she deflected from answering the question, made Gareth wonder about the sorts of messages that parents are giving these kids.

Gareth feels that these young people have enough on their plate without them believing that the world is going to end really soon, and adults are deliberately doing nothing about it, because they don't care about the young people and their future.

He feels that the correct approach is for adults to soothe their fears with explanations about why the world isn't as scary as they imagine.

They should guide and reassure them, placing problems into their proper context and teaching strategies to allay, not amp up, anxiety. Adults should equip kids with skills, knowledge and techniques to make sense of the world and have autonomy over their own lives.

Channel the passion into things that can be fixed at a kid scale.

He feels the saying: "think globally and act locally" has much to commend it. This means, control the things you can in your own backyard, which will contribute to improving the bigger picture.

Gareth's presentation was very interesting, thought provoking and promoted a lot of discussion. **Rod Rate** presented **Gareth** with one of our Club's Micro Bat Boxes in thanks for his presentation.

Thank you to the people who volunteered to be rostered on to help, however we still need a few more volunteers on the day. If you can help please contact **Colin**.



The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig and sign, Joker container and two bottles of wine.
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
