Guest Speaker ~ Fiona Scarff ~ A research Scientist at Murdoch University 'Cat Bib Study ~ Protection of our Wildlife'



Dr Fiona Scarff

Dr Fiona Scarff, is a Murdoch University, Research Associate in Environmental and Conservation Sciences. Fiona and her team are carrying out a study on how effective cat bibs can be in protecting wildlife from prowling cats.

Dr Scarff says waking up to entrails in the garden is often part and parcel of cat ownership, but many people feel it's something they can't control.

Cats naturally hunt prey and target native species picking on birds foraging and nesting close to the ground, small mammals – like quendas, and reptiles.

In response, the university developed the cat bib several years ago, and Dr Scarff now wants to test some new designs.

The research team believe that the bib provides a big block of colour that alerts prey animals and physically interferes with the cat's pounce.

Cats wearing the bib are still able to run, jump, climb, groom, feed and snooze as normal.

The bibs have already been shown to be highly effective in reducing bird captures, and also provide a level of protection to other prey animals.

The research unit has been involved in studies of cats and their foraging behaviour for over three decades. They have explored topics such as what cats eat, how far they roam and their impact on wildlife.

Is your cat a hunter? - we may be able to help

Dr Scarff is currently looking for new research participants and is enrolling people who “own cats, love their cats, but are worried about the impact of their cats on local wildlife”.

We're looking for cat owners who'd be prepared to volunteer their moggy for a 6-week trial of the bib. People anywhere in Perth and the south-west of WA can participate, but we need cats that are active hunters, bringing in at least one prey item a week.

Sausage Sizzle Saturday December 14

Colin said we need more volunteers to help out on the day and to help cut buns and sausages on the day before, Friday December 13.

We are trying to source buns that are already cut, or easier to cut, as the ones we had last time were quite different in size and difficult to cut, so we ended up with a few problems and a lot of buns we couldn't use. We only have two sausage sizzles a year, so we need to make the most of the opportunity to raise some money, so we can help those in need.

Sausage Sizzle for Kate Pearson

Colin spoke about **Kate**, our National Youth Science Forum candidate, who had a sausage sizzle at East Victoria Park last Saturday. Kate and family were hoping to sell about 250 sausage sizzles but ended up selling over 300, which with drinks, would have probably earned them over \$500. This will help pay for Kate's NYSF expenses.

We were happy to facilitate Kate's sausage sizzle by providing our public liability insurance.

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA)



If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, donations tin, Joker container and two bottles of wine.
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
