

Guest Speaker

Dr Graham Forward ~ 'Australian Doctors in Africa'



Dr Graham Forward, President Gail McCulloch, Robert Forward, Selwyn Castles

Dr Graham Forward is a qualified Orthopaedic Surgeon working full time in Perth.

In 2004 he embarked on what has become an extraordinary humanitarian journey. In response to the emergency medical requirements resulting from the 2004 tsunami, he organised a medical team to travel to Somalia, in an effort to aid swift recovery from the natural disaster.

In 2005 he established Australian Doctors for Africa (ADFA) to help relieve communities in the Horn of Africa from some of their most severe medical and health difficulties. Graham's vision has been to provide long-term medical assistance in ways that complement host countries' health care plans.

Dr Forward is the Founder, Director and CEO of Australian Doctors for Africa

Since 2005, the organisation has grown into a charity engaging some 70 medical professionals who provide voluntary medical, surgical and nursing services to Ethiopia, Somalia and Madagascar.

The organisation sends at least 15 volunteer teams of medical specialists annually, to provide medical services and assess and implement skills transfer, through medical consultation, surgical and non-surgical treatment and training local doctors and students.

The objective is to enable a trained, sustainable local surgical workforce in each of the target countries.

While the initial focus of ADFA was on the provision of orthopaedic services through implementing local screening clinics and training local medical staff and surgeons in early detection and treatment, it has broadened to include specialised teams with expertise in urology, gastroenterology, obstetrics, gynaecology and paediatrics.

Since 2013, ADFA has been supporting infrastructure upgrades through the provision of surgical and hospital equipment, building renovations, hospital wards, water supply and capacity-building initiatives to improve medical facilities in major government teaching hospitals.

ADFA plans to continue supporting its existing medical training programs and expansion of the scope of specialist surgical teams it provides to include, cardiologists, in addition to plaster technicians, physiotherapists, emergency GPs, anaesthetists and nurses.

Graham's father, Robert Forward has worked as an enthusiastic and committed volunteer with Australian Doctors for Africa for 10 years as well as being a member of the Board of Management.

In this time, Robert has developed a network for receipt, assembly, packing and despatch of donated equipment.

He has sent over 50 containers, each loaded with several hundred thousand dollars' worth of medical equipment and supplies, to hospitals in Ethiopia, Somaliland and Madagascar.

Those present at the meeting were very interested in the wonderful work being done by Dr Graham Forward and his father Robert Forward and congratulate them on what they have and plan to achieve.


Reports



If members are unable to undertake their allocated duty on any date, please arrange a swap.

The **set up and pack up** Rotarians shall:

- Arrive at least 30 mins before the meeting starting time
- Retrieve the small Australian flags, the Sergeant's gavel and gong, collection box, international pig and sign and two bottles of wine.
- The small flags shall be spread around the tables.
- The Sergeant's and President's items are to be placed on the President's table
- The microphones provided by Tompkins on Swan shall be turned on and tested
- At the completion of the meeting, all items shall be returned to the storeroom cupboard

The **hosts** shall:

- Arrive at least 30 minutes before meeting starting time
- Retrieve the wooden badge holder cabinet from the storeroom and place it within greeting area
- Greet all Rotarians with a handshake and give them their badge.
- Greet guests and welcome them and introduce them to at least two Rotarians
- Greet the guest speaker if the Chairperson is unavailable
- After the meeting, retrieve all name badges, place them in the wooden cabinet and return to storeroom

The **chairperson** shall:

- Read the Bulletin in advance and then contact Program Director for CV of speaker
- Arrive at Dinner Meeting venue at least 35 mins before starting time
- Greet and welcome the GS at the entrance and introduce them to the President and at least four Rotarians
- Assist the GS to setup his/her audio/visual and any other aids
- Show GS where to sit down for dinner on President's table and where to speak
- Invite the GS to stay for tea or coffee afterwards and ask them if they are happy to answer questions then
- Advise GS to speak for 20-30 minutes (or as agreed with Programme Director) including questions
- Introduce the GS by name and topic when requested by the President
- Formally introduce the GS by written CV addressing name, vocation, qualifications, family (if appropriate), interests and lastly topic. This should take from one to two minutes only.
- Chair the speaker session allowing one question per Rotarian or Guest
- Terminate the session with the presentation of the gift coaster (from Secretary)
- Escort the GS to the door after the meeting (and to their vehicle if appropriate)
